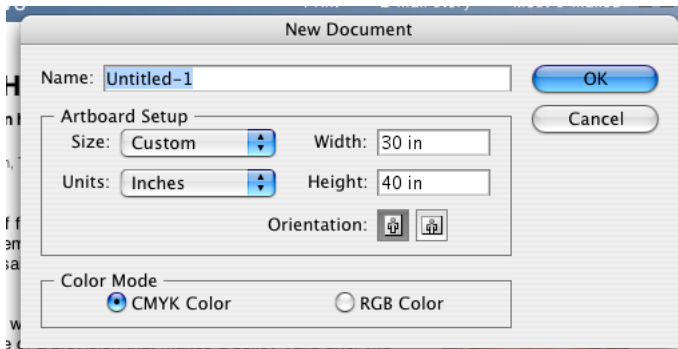
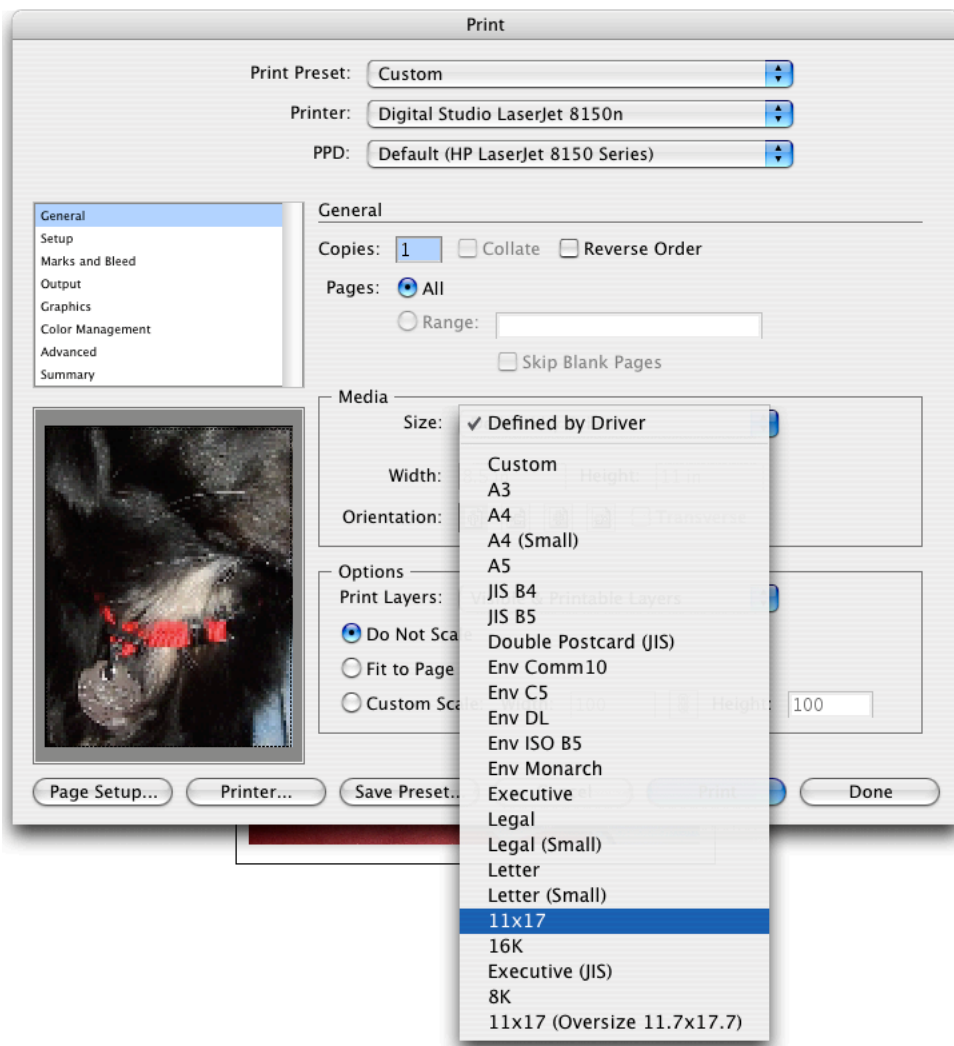


Tiling Oversized Images from Adobe Illustrator

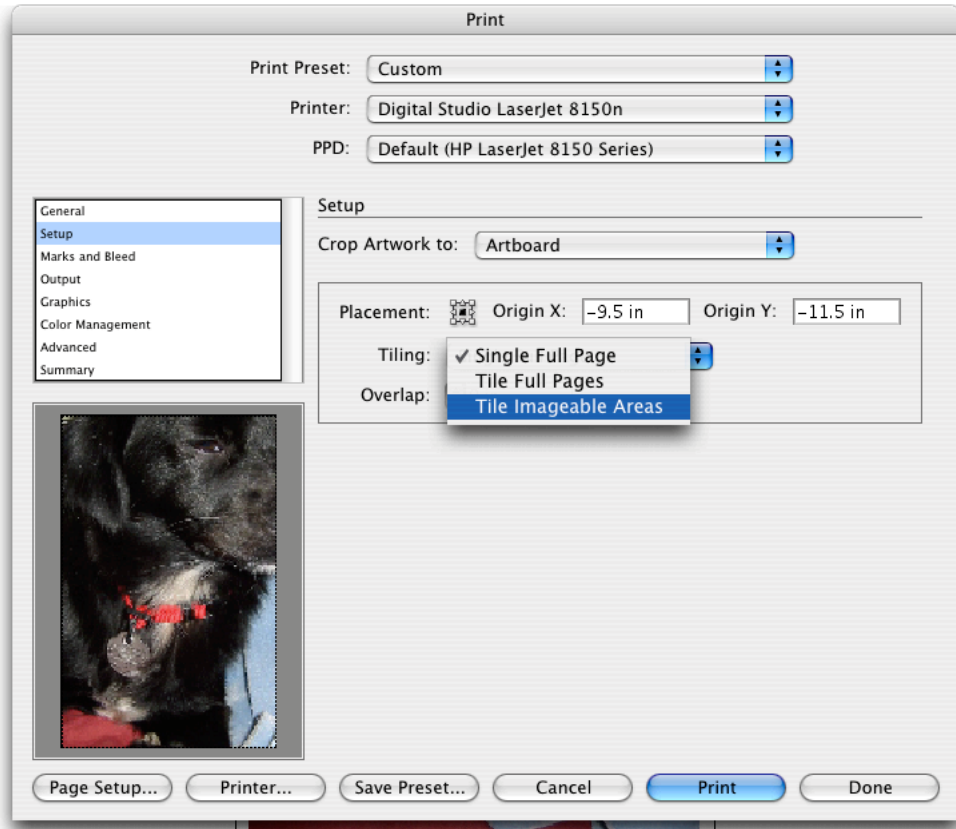


When creating your image, set the document size to the desired final output size, not the size of the paper you will be using. You can change the document size under *File > Document Setup* if working on an existing file.

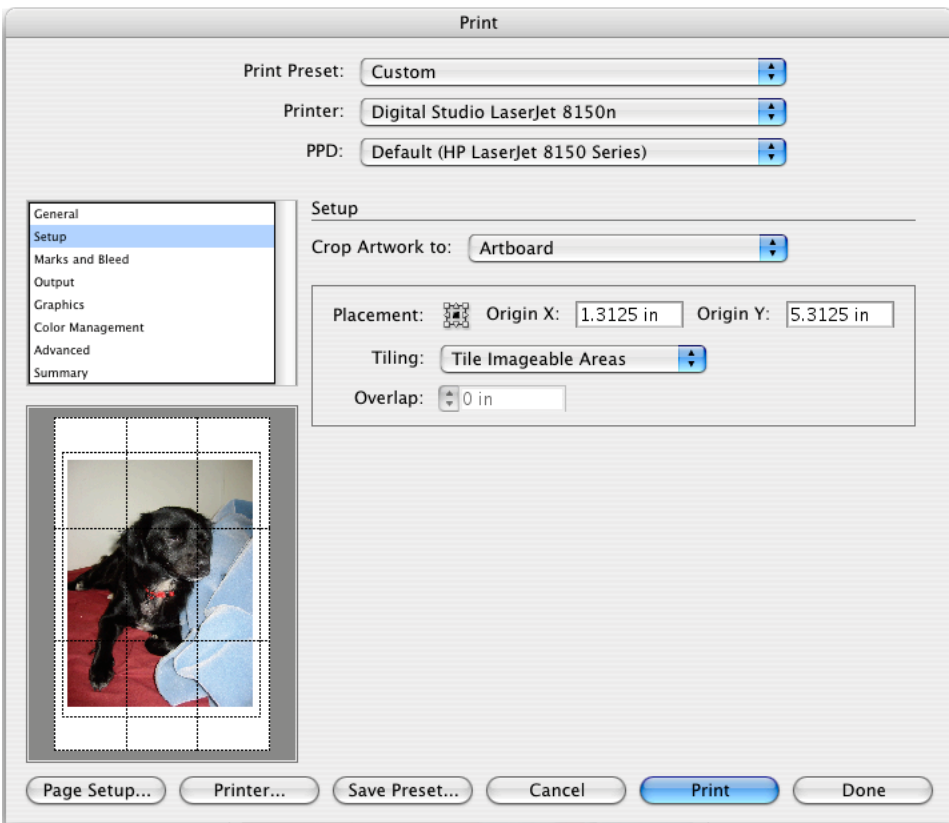
Create your image at the size it should print, then choose *File > Print*.



In the printing dialog box, check that the “Printer” dropdown at the top is correctly set, then select “General” from the left navigation and set the Media Size dropdown to the size of the paper you will be using (either letter or 11x17 for the Digital Studio LaserJet 8150n).



Next, select the “Setup” option on the left and set “Tiling” to “Tile Imageable Areas”. You can also change the “Overlap” value to control how much sheets should overlap one another—a value of .25 inches is usually plenty, less may be desirable.



After verifying that the preview at bottom left of the window shows the entire image with a page grid superimposed on it (as shown), click “Print”.
